Projects

Fifth Grade

We used colorful paper to create a paper sculpture. This took a ton of patience and practice to get each tube to stay in place. Next, we learned about Linocut Printmaking. Students carved out a decorative beetle using a linoleum cutter. After the image was carved, we applied ink to our printing block to make 4 identical prints.



Fourth Grade

We completed our radial printmaking project. Students created a simple design and embossed the design to a printing plate. Once the printing plate was completed, they used ink and a brayer to make a radial print. We ended the year learning how to make a self-portrait.



Third Grade

We began the semester learning how to draw self-portraits. Next, we created a landscape using sharpie and watercolor paint. Students learned about foreground and background. They also learned how to create silhouettes in their artwork. These were simply beautiful.



Second Grade

Second grade used line and shape to create an abstract spring flower garden. These colorful creations are one of my favorites. We ended the school year creating a Chinese Dragon. Students drew their very own dragon using markers. Then, they added construction paper to the background for a 3-dimensional effect.



First Grade

Students used a combinations of tempera paint, construction paper, and crayon to create a flower bouquet. These were so much fun! The next project, students created their very own decorative monster. They were encouraged to be as creative as they could by adding to this silly monster creation.



Kindergarten

We used line, shape, and color to make a silly caterpillar. Next, we learned about space while making our very own rocket ship. We added planets and stars to our background while we blasted off into space. Last, we ended the semester talking about springtime baby birds.
